

Shreveport, La (February 25, 2021) – Southern University at Shreveport, LA (SUSLA) to solidify historic partnership with Uganda in a Virtual MOU Signing event on Monday, March 1, 2021.

Southern University at Shreveport will add a new, exciting chapter in the University's history on Monday, when it announces an agreement with its new educational partners, Advance International University of Uganda. University officials representing both institutions will share details of the program and services that will be offered in a virtual signing ceremony. SUSLA's Chancellor, Dr. Rodney Ellis, states that he is pleased at the "opportunity and for what this partnership will do to help expand SUSLA's international footprint, while increasing educational opportunities to citizens of Uganda.

SUSLA FACULTY & STAFF ATTENDED THE HBCU AFFORDABLE LEARNING SOLUTIONS CONFERENCE








Southern University Museum of Art Shreveport (SUMAS) hosted a traveling exhibit, Determined to Rise: The Woman's Suffrage Movement in Louisiana, celebrates the challenges and triumphs of the women's suffrage movement in Louisiana in celebration of the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment giving women the right to vote. This exhibition was on display March 1-12, 2021 at the Downtown Metro Center campus located at 610 Texas Street, Ste. 110, Shreveport, Louisiana.

Developed by the Centennial Woman's Suffrage Project (CWSP) at Southeastern Louisiana University and with grant support from the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities (LEH) Rebirth grant program the exhibit consists of eight panels depicting photos of Louisiana suffragists, a timeline of significant events, the movement from the African American woman's perspective, laws that have changed since women gained the vote, and Louisiana women who have made their mark on history.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Karen T. La Beau is a self-taught, third generation artist, New Orleans, La. native who now resides in Shreveport, La. La Beau began drawing at the age of six and began painting professionally in 2007. In 2012, La Beau was honored at the North Louisiana-Multicultural Center as a woman artist in NWLA; in 2015 she was selected by International Artist; Nick Cave to be one of six artists who were awarded an artist residency for his 2015-2016 project, "As Is" in Shreveport, LA.

In 2017, she was awarded the "Cultural Preservation Heritage Award" in New Orleans; and the "Artist Fellowship Award by the Shreveport Regional Arts Council. Karen was highlighted in a news segment for Black History Month titled, "Standing on the Shoulders of Legends."

Whitney Tates is a Shreveport based artist and muralist. Her work is inspired by nature, space, and mental health awareness. Whitney has created multiple murals in Dallas and Shreveport/Bossier and has shown her work across Louisiana. She is a juried roster artist and collectible artist of the Northwest Louisiana. Whitney holds a BA in Studio Art from Centenary College of Louisiana.

Yolanda Barnes is a native of Chicago Heights, Illinois. A self-proclaimed evolving artist, she has always loved different forms of art—acrylics, pencil, watercolors, and mixed media. In recent years, art has been the catalyst for her healing through intense personal challenges and losses. As a result, she has been able to channel feelings and various experiences through her art. Yolanda loves to depict her subjects in bold colors or themes that express her cultural heritage as an African American woman. Bold colors exemplify her work whether subjects or abstract. Her work has been exhibited at artspace in 2020, during the 2020 Black Out Exhibition, and R.W. Norton Art Gallery in 2019. Her desire is to inspire others to step into their creative callings, whatever it may be.



MS KICK TENANTS PARTICIPATE IN 318 RESTAURANT WEEK MARCH 15-20



318 Restaurant Week is a week-long culinary project of the Shreveport-Bossier Convention and Tourist Bureau and has returned for the dates of March 15TH -20TH. This event consists of six days of deals at Shreveport-Bossier eateries, offering dining patrons \$10 lunch specials, \$20 dinner specials, and various dining experiences at participating restaurants. This year, dining patrons were able to download a free 318 Restaurant Week app that lists all the participating restaurants and their specials.

The MS KICK tenants participating in the 318 Restaurant Week are Taylor'd Eatz, that specializes in Authentic Jamaican cuisine, Vegans on the Run, a family owned business that offers Southern Comfort Vegan food, and Big Nate's BBQ, home of the "Big Nasty", which is a quarter pound of hamburger meat, pulled pork, sausage topped with coleslaw and barbecue sauce on a bun. This is the first year for these businesses to participate and they have pulled out the stops to attract new customers and keep their loyal fans coming back for more.

There's never been a more critical time for our community to support restaurants hit by COVID-19 and Winter Storm Uri than during318 Restaurant Week," said Brandy Evans, vice president of communications at the Tourist Bureau.
