The summit provided a dynamic platform for engaging faculty and staff in advancing Reimagine SUSLA 2030, the university's five-year strategic plan. Greetings from Dr. Aubra J. Gantt, Chancellor, and President Dennis J. Shields of the Southern University System, setting an inspiring tone for the event.

One of the highlights was the interactive session "Personality Poker: Discover Your Player Profile," led by Dr. Sharon Green, Associate Professor at SUSLA, which encouraged participants to reflect on their personal strengths and teamwork styles. The summit also welcomed new team members, fostering a sense of community and shared purpose. Chancellor Gantt formally introduced Reimagine SUSLA 2030, while Mr. Major Brock, Assistant Director of Strategic Planning, Evaluation, and Policy, outlined the plan's framework. The summit featured thought-"Playing the Game: provoking Initiatives" **Enrollment** Strategic presentations from leaders across higher education, including Dr. Gavin Hamms, Vice President of Enrollment **Management at the University of Holy** Cross, who used a football metaphor to illustrate the urgency and precision required in advancing enrollment strategies, and Dr. Cynthia Hester of Jarvis Christian University, emphasized the importance embracing a truly student-centered culture in the "Betting on Every Student: Going from "Odds Are" to "All In" session. Southern University System leaders Wynton Johnson and Sandra Stepter spoke on "Doubling Down on **Infrastructure: Every Investment Leads to a Win" providing** important updates on campus repairs, upgrades, and capital









Afternoon breakout sessions allowed participants to engage with topics such as "Slots of Opportunity: Cultivating Resilient Teamwork", "The Winning Hand: Mastering the Art of Communication", and "In a High-Stakes Game, Safety is Not a Gamble."

















The event concluded with closing remarks from Chancellor Gantt, who reaffirmed SUSLA's unwavering commitment to "Reimagining SUSLA with Students First."
