A comparison of SUSLA's Spring 2023 Enrollment Snapshot as of January 30, 2023, relative to a similar registration period in Spring 2022 demonstrates the following:

- 15.8% increase in the total number of registered students
- 26.2% increase in the number of PAID students
- 82.6% increase in dual enrollment
- 2.1% increase in the number of continuing students

SUSLA's Spring Enrollment Snapshot as of January 30, 2023, mirrors the tremendous growth in SUSLA's enrollment experienced in Fall 2022, where the University posted the following enrollment record:

## SUSLA SPRING 2023 REGISTRATION & RECRUITMENT INITIATIVES



SUSLA's Student Affairs & Enrollment Management Division implemented a series of strategic programs, such as e-communications, on-site registration, etc., beginning in November 2022 through the present to ensure a healthy enrollment trend for Spring 2023. As of January 30, 2023, registration and recruitment initiatives are being implemented. They include, but not limited to the following:


- E-Communications to encourage students to register for their spring classes. A total of 55 campaigns were executed, including text, social media, email, and voicemail for new student enrollment and continuing student registration.
- Registration events were also a strategy to provide students with access to faculty and staff to enhance spring enrollment. A total of five (5) events were held, including:
- Two (2) Zoom registrations allowed students to meet with staff virtually.
- Three (3) Pop-Up registrations were held in the cafeteria to give students access to staff.
- One (1) on-site registration was held in partnership with advisement in the Administration building.
- Three (3) on-site and advisement registrations are scheduled for January 13th, 17th, and 18th.
- STOP-OUT e-communications campaign was executed to encourage re-admission for Spring 2023.

## The Spring 2023 Faculty & Staff Institute

The Spring 2023 SUSLA Faculty & Staff Institute was a resounding success. ReNew ReSet ReConnect was the theme of the day. Mr. Colton Wiggins, Director for Polysomnography, officiated the program. Interim Chancellor, Dr. Vladimir A. Appeaning, delivered the State of the University Address. Next, Faculty and Staff were provided with campus updates by the directors for Human Resources; Accreditation, Planning & Outcome Assessment; and Title IX, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, and ADA/Section 504, as well as the Vice Chancellors for the following divisions: Academic Affairs and Workforce Development; Student Affairs and Enrollment Management; and Finance and Administration. The HBCU C<sup>2</sup> Apple Technology Innovation team conducted a workshop on the Apple's audio/video software application, providing a significant learning opportunity while also actively engaging the faculty and staff in attendance.



The HBCU C² Apple Technology Innovation community is committed to creating opportunities to diversify the tech workforce by removing barriers, innovating STEAM education, and developing life-long learning pathways. During the spring 2023 Faculty/Staff Institute, SUSLA's HBCU C² Innovation Team conducted a workshop on the Apple's Clips application. As a result, Faculty and Staff created thirty-second video clips on-site promoting the university. Southern University at Shreveport (SUSLA) and The Southern University at Shreveport Foundation (SUSF) announced the 2023 presentation of The Frank Taylor Jr. Memorial Scholarship for the second year. The presentation took place on Friday, January 20, 2023, at SUSLA's Main Campus in Shreveport.

The scholarship was established in 2022 by the family of Frank Taylor Jr. He was an engineering student at SUSLA, as well as the President of the Student Government Association and a Student Representative on the Southern University System Board of SupervisorsW. During his extensive career in engineering, he was an Electrical Engineer/Shipbuilder with the Department of Defense. The January 20th presentation of the scholarship also marks Taylor's birthday.

To highlight the legacy of Taylor's achievements in engineering, the scholarship is designated each year for a deserving student matriculating in Business, Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (BSTEM) studies. This year's recipient is Alex Alexander, a second-year Computer Science student at SUSLA.

Taylor was also a minister, community leader and mentor to others seeking careers in the STEM field. The Frank Taylor Jr. Memorial Scholarship is a 20-year commitment from the family to award \$500 each year.










