## BROOKSHIRE'S DONATION BECOMES \$100K ENDOWMENT WITH BOARD OF REGENTS MATCH AT SUSLA



At SUSLA's 2021 Faculty- Staff Institute, Dr. Rodney Ellis and Chief Advancement Officer, Stephanie Rogers, were joined by Brookshire's District Manager Jay Holmes to announce the organization's initial gift has been fully matched.

Brookshire's invested \$30,000 to establish the Brookshire's - Super 1 Foods First Generation Scholarship. The gift was matched by \$30,000 non-state funds and a \$40,000 award from the Louisiana Board of Regents to become fully endowed at \$100,000.

Mr. Holmes states that, "Brookshire's is pleased to partner with SUSLA as part of their initiative to strengthen the workforce by investing over \$1Million to support schools in its service areas". Chancellor Ellis expressed his appreciation for the gift stating that, "investments from partners like Brookshire's are essential in closing the gap for citizens seeking financial equity and career opportunities. This starts with access to training and degree attainment."

Rogers noted "...the match opportunities from the Louisiana Board of Regents serves as an attractive incentive for partners seeking to maximize their investments in higher education within our state."


















## SUSLA'S EMT C-3 PREPARES THE GROUP OF FIRST RESPONDERS



We recently dropped in on the EMT C-3 class to observe a group of future First Responders. Students were practicing hands-on drills in SUSLA'S state-of-the art EMS Simulator under the watchful eye of their Instructor, Mr. Kevin Coleman.

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to test for the EMT State Certification. When they pass, the certification, they will be qualified to work as an EMT and, the state certification will also qualify them to advance their studies of pursuing Paramedic instructions needed to test for and obtain their state Paramedic License.

Students say when they finish the course, they plan to pursue careers with the Fire Departments as EMTs, and Paramedics. Mr Coleman has a long career of over 30 years an Emergency Medical Provider. 28 of those years have been with Caddo Fire Dept. He has been teaching the profession for approximately 20 years.

## SUSLA OFFERS AN INTENSE TRAINING PROGRAM TO THE CALUMET LUBRICANTS IN SHREVEPORT



Southern University at Shreveport Community and Workforce Development delivered an intense training program to the Calumet Lubricants plant in Shreveport Louisiana. As per the request of the company's plant leadership, the program concentrated in the following areas:

- Process Operations Training 2.5 weeks
- Operations Safety 1.5 weeks

The program started on Monday, August 23, 2021, and ended September 17, 2021. The trainees met every day, five days a week, for four weeks, from 7 am to 3:30 pm. At the company's training center.

The uniqueness of this effort that SUS was called to execute was:

Upon completion of their training, the trainees received two Continuing Education Certificates. From Southern University at Shreveport. These were:

- Process Plant Operations 9.6 CEUs
- Process Plant Operations Safety 5.6 CEUs

In addition, and for the first time in the history of the State of Louisiana, SUSLA, and Calumet Lubricants, the Calumet Lubricants Trainees successfully took and passed the National Institute for Uniformed License Power Engineers 4th Class National Certification examinations for Process Plant Operations and Operations Safety. This exercise exemplifies the excellence and innovative practices implemented by the Southern University at Shreveport meeting the needs of the chemical plant and refinery industries, the quality of the training that was delivered that was validated by a National Certifying agency.

Calumet Lubricants is pleased with the program training process and outcomes, SUSLA's undertaking under the leadership of Dr. John K. Galiotos Dean of Workforce Development in organizing, coordinating, and delivering such services, and they hope to institutionalize this relationship with SUSLA towards future training initiatives.

## LOCAL CHEFS PROVIDE HEALTHY COOKING DEMOS WITH "KIDS KOOKING IN THE KITCHEN"



MS KICK through SUSLA Continuing Education, hosted "Kids Kooking in the Kitchen," with four local chefs from the Shreveport/Bossier Areas. During this summer camp, the participants learned the various tools needed to prepare the recipes, healthy recipes that are easily replicated at home, and the importance of Food Safety in the kitchen.

The summer camp spanned over the Summer months with four sessions featuring a different Local Chef as the lead instructor for the cooking demonstrations. The chefs were Chef Melanie of Southern Suga by Mel, Chef Hardette of Us up North, Chef Blake Jackson of Whisk Dessert Bar, and Chef Mark of ReMarkable Foods. Each chef brought their own uniqueness and style of cooking while emphasizing the importance of correct knife skills, utilizing fresh vegetables in the preparation of healthy meals, and providing cultural and historical backgrounds of the dishes they were preparing during the Cooking demonstrations.

The campers appreciated the one on one experience with each Chef as it was shown through their eagerness to learn and enjoy the dishes that each prepared. "Kids close their ears to advice but, open their eyes to example. We as adults must show the right way and not just tell them. That's not just for cooking recipes that's for life recipes as well", when asked what he felt the greatest take away from Kids Kooking in the Kitchen summer camp. The camp hosted over 20 kids from different backgrounds and was composed of boys and girls.
