SUNO Professor Represents the United States in Prestigious State Department Speaker Program in Egypt

NEW ORLEANS, LA — Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) proudly announces that Dr. Haitham Eid, Professor of Museum Studies, recently represented the United States in a distinguished engagement through the U.S. Department of State Speaker Program. This highly selective initiative brings leading American experts to international audiences to foster crosscultural dialogue, innovation, and collaboration.

During his visit to Egypt, Dr. Eid delivered a series of lectures and workshops hosted by prominent institutions, including the American Research Center in Egypt (ARCE), the American Center in Cairo, and Ain Shams University. His sessions centered on museum innovation, cultural heritage preservation, and community engagement, attracting museum professionals, scholars, and students from across the region.

In addition to his speaking engagements, Dr. Eid conducted professional visits to the newly inaugurated Grand Egyptian Museum—the largest archaeological museum in the world—as well as the Egyptian Museum in Tahrir and other cultural institutions. These visits allowed for meaningful exchanges with Egyptian curators and museum leaders on global best practices in preservation and interpretation.

His program, coordinated by the U.S. Embassy in Cairo, garnered extensive media attention, underscoring the significance of his contributions to the international museum community.
