Grants Report Summary

August 2010

This report includes grant proposals submitted by campuses in the Southern University System (SUS). Essentially, campus sponsored program offices operate to increase overall research efforts and to increase funding for prioritized areas of need.

The Office of Research and Strategic Initiatives at the Southern University at Baton Rouge campus received \$1,635,967.74 in grants funding. The SU Ag Center made grant applications that total in the amount of \$581,574. The Southern University at Shreveport campus received \$1,522,726 in grants and research funding for the month.
