Chancellor Pierre Participates in APLU Council of 1890 Universities Summer Meeting



Chancellor John K. Pierre participated in the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU) Council of 1890 Universities Summer Meeting, held on June 23, 2025, in Washington, D.C. The convening brought together presidents and chancellors of historically Black land-grant universities established under the Second Morrill Act of 1890, marking a continued commitment to advancing educational equity and systemic opportunity for underserved communities.

The Second Morrill Act, passed in 1890, 28 years after the original 1862 Morrill Act, authorized federal support for land-grant universities serving persons of color in states that maintained segregated admissions policies. These institutions, now proudly known as 1890 Universities, have long been recognized for "serving the underserved" and "reaching the unreached," and remain vital engines for access, innovation, and economic mobility in historically marginalized communities.

The Council of 1890 Universities, composed of the chief executives of APLU-member 1890 institutions, functions as a strategic body committed to strengthening teaching, research, and extension programs across member campuses. It serves as a unified voice on issues impacting Black land-grant universities, advocating for robust federal investment, equitable policy, and institutional sustainability. The Council also provides a collaborative forum to exchange ideas and develop a shared agenda around funding, congressional engagement, and national programmatic priorities.

Chancellor Pierre's participation in the 2025 Summer Meeting underscores Southern University's leadership in this national dialogue and affirms its continued role as a steward of educational access, agricultural advancement, and community-based innovation. His engagement contributes to a unified effort to ensure the enduring success of 1890 institutions in addressing the pressing needs of rural and urban communities alike.



Chancellor John K. Pierre Attends 2025 SWAC COPC Spring Meeting



Chancellor Pierre joined presidents and chancellors from across the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) for the annual Council of Presidents and Chancellors (COPC) Spring Meeting, held in Destin, Florida June 13–14, 2025. The two-day meeting brought together institutional leaders to discuss transformative developments in collegiate athletics, compliance, and student-athlete equity.

The meeting marked a pivotal moment in collegiate athletics for HBCUs, particularly in light of the recently approved House v. NCAA settlement, which carries far-reaching implications for athlete compensation and institutional compliance. All 12 SWAC institutions, including Southern University, unanimously agreed to adopt the settlement framework. This landmark decision allows schools to offer unrestricted scholarships across all sports while maintaining athlete roster limits based on historical averages.

In addition, the SWAC voted to remove long-standing scholarship caps, an unprecedented step expected to significantly enhance athlete recruitment, retention, and support, especially for historically underfunded programs. The conference also reaffirmed its commitment to transparency and equity by establishing updated standards for compliance and oversight. As part of this commitment, the Council of Presidents and Chancellors pledged to implement the settlement's provisions through the newly established College Sports Commission and the NCAA's CAPS system, ensuring rigorous institutional accountability and athlete-centered governance.

Chancellor Pierre's active engagement at the spring meeting reflects Southern University's unwavering dedication to athletic excellence, student success, and equity-driven leadership. His participation positions Southern at the forefront of historic shifts in higher education and intercollegiate sports.



A team of university leaders recently attended the UNCF Unite 2025 Conference in Atlanta, Georgia, a national convening of higher education leaders, experts, and change agents committed to advancing equity, innovation, and outcomes for students at HBCUs. The Enrollment Management team consisted of Dr. Anthony Jackson, Vice Chancellor of Enrollment Management; Mr. Michael Taylor, Associate Vice Chancellor for Enrollment Management; and Mr. Michael Wells, Director of Admissions and Recruitment. Representing the Office of Academic Affairs was Dr. Karen Jackson, Interim Assistant Vice Chancellor for Student Success. They are collectively engaging in sessions, panels, and collaborative learning experiences centered around enhancing student retention, academic progression, and completion, key pillars in the university's strategic framework for student achievement.

The conference, hosted by the United Negro College Fund (UNCF), provides a valuable platform for institutions to share best practices, access data-driven tools, and explore scalable solutions that address both enrollment trends and student success challenges. The presence of both Enrollment Management and Student Success leaders underscores the university's commitment to a holistic and coordinated approach to student support, from recruitment to graduation.

Southern University Leads in Cutting-Edge Computing Collaboration with LSU

Southern University is once again proving that excellence and innovation are at the heart of Jaguar Nation. In a bold new step forward, Southern has joined forces with Louisiana State University in a groundbreaking partnership to advance high-performance, energy-efficient computing across the state.

Funded by a \$1.5 million grant from the National Science Foundation, the initiative centers on expanding access to training in HPX (High Performance ParalleX) a powerful software library that enables scalable, energy-conscious computing for real-world applications.

"Southern's role in this partnership is about access, innovation, and leadership," said Dr. Lynette Jackson, Associate Professor of Computer Science at Southern. "We are preparing students not only to earn degrees but to drive solutions in energy, climate, and tech."

Southern University is not just a participant, we are a key driver in this transformational project:

- Faculty Leadership: Southern's own Dr. Lynette Jackson, Associate Professor of Computer Science, is spearheading efforts to design and deliver curriculum in C++, parallel computing, and HPX, ensuring that students are prepared for 21st-century workforce demands.
- Curriculum Development: Brand new courses are being developed and launched right here at Southern, offering students hands-on experiences that lead to industry-recognized microcredentials through platforms like Credly.
- Student Training & Impact: This summer, Southern University trained students and faculty
 as part of the pilot cohort. These Jaguars will join a statewide network of learners, with the
 program set to grow to 150 participants by next year, making Southern a major talent pipeline
 in Louisiana's computing and energy sectors.
- National Recognition: The collaborative work between Southern and LSU has already earned
 national attention, with HPX being accepted into the High Performance Software
 Foundation, placing our students and faculty at the forefront of the global software
 community.

Southern University is not just enhancing its academic framework, it is boldly shaping the future of energy-efficient computing. Through this transformative partnership with LSU, Jaguar Nation is equipping students with the tools to lead in a fast-changing tech landscape.

As the program grows and earns national recognition, Southern stands at the forefront of innovation, demonstrating the power of collaboration, vision, and opportunity. This is how leaders are made and how the future is forged.


