

Southern University Receives Nursing School of the Year Honors

The Southern University School of Nursing has been recognized by the Louisiana Nurse Foundation as the 2021Nightingale Award recipient for the Nursing School of The Year, Graduate Degree Programs. This is the fifth time that the School of Nursing has been chosen as Nursing School/Program of the Year. Southern was also selected as Nursing School/Program of the Year in 2010, 2012, 2015 and 2017.

Dean Sandra Brown received the D. Jensen Holliday Memorial Award from the Mary Bird Perkins Cancer Center (MBPCC) in recognition for her sustained and measurable difference in the fight against cancer and for her outstanding leadership and visionary skills in working for the greater good and betterment of the community. The award was presented to Dr. Brown on Oct. 20 in conjunction with the annual SUBR Homecoming Health Fair.

Department of Language and Literature



The School of Education

- The School of Education was awarded funds for the Federal Work Study Experimental Project written by Dr. Verjanis Peoples. The project provides funds for service in teacher education in the areas of student teaching, year-long residency and field experiences.
- The Eta Mu Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi, International (an honor society in education) won two awards based on the chapter's accomplishments during the 2020-2021 academic year. The awards received were: the 2020-2021 Community Service Chapter Program Award and the Celebration of Teaching Award for our "Popping in the Pandemic" Project. The chapter will be recognized for its achievement at the Kappa Delta Pi International's first Virtual Convo, scheduled for Nov. 5 at 2 p.m. Dr. Alisa M. University College Initiatives

• The University College (UC) hosted **the Midterm Grab N' Go Breakfast** and provided free scantrons for students engaged in in-person testing. This initiative was supported by approximately 400 first- and second-year students. The breakfast is an annual event hosted in the Smith-Brown Memorial Student Union. To ensure students are well versed, prepared, and motivated to deal with the many challenges that they will face throughout the first and second year, there were a total of three powerful motivational speakers who attended the College Success Skills course to discuss mental health, being authentically you, the importance of time management and emotional intelligence.



- The University College Academic Advisors have assisted approximately 500 first year students with Spring 2022 advising from Nov. 1-9. This assistance was in many forms including: FAFSA Invasion, Registration Invasion, Robo Calls, personal phone calls and customized emails to ensure students receive the courses aligned with their respective disciplines.
