Museum and Archive Buildout





While the outgoing 2013 AACSB accreditation standard was more audit based, the new 2020 AACSB Standard is princi-

ples-based. These training sessions provide opportunities for business school deans that serve as gatekeepers to become immersed in the mindset of a principle-based interpretation of practices and supporting documents submitted in pursuit of initial or continuing accreditation by AACSB international.
