Student Health Services

The SUNO Student Health Services Program continues to make sure that the overall safety of students, faculty, and staff is our top priority. The university requires all students, faculty, and staff to be vaccinated unless they report religious or medical reasons. We continue to have our weekly vaccine drive held every Wednesday in the University Center from 11:30 am to 2:30 pm. Both the university community and the neighboring community are invited to participate.

The \$100 vaccine incentive program is still in effect. All first-time shot recipients are eligible to receive the incentive card. All are urged to receive the vaccine. The National Guard has also started administering the booster vaccine. So if you have not received your vaccine or booster vaccine, stop by and see us. PCR Covid testing is available Monday-Thursday. There is no testing on Friday.

Although the State and City Mask Mandate has been lifted, the Southern University System will continue to follow our current mask policy. Masks are to be worn indoors, in public settings, and when social distancing may be difficult.

Trail, P.E., about the ongoing proposal of Lake Pontchartrain as a Louisiana National Estuarine Research Reserve System (LA NERR). Kristi L. Trail is the lead of this effort, and she is also the Executive Director of the Non-Profit Organization "Pontchartrain Conservancy." Governor John Bel Edwards' office initiated the first steps of the lengthy process to apply or prepare for a proposal to the NERR program in 2019. Dr. Tietzel was designated by the Chancellor of SUNO, Dr. James H. Ammons, Jr., as the point of contact for SUNO. Dr. Tietzel participated in previous preparatory LaNERR meetings in the last twelve months hosted by Dr. Robert Twilley.

On October 20, 2021, Louis Thompson from the NASA Office of STEM engagement (STEM), Maria Meador-Phillips, NASA MSFC Internship Program Coordinator, and others responded to Dr. Illya Tietzel and gave a presentation to interested SUNO students and faculty about student internships at NASA. 
October 27, 2021:

Curator/Archivist's Component of CAAAS

Ms. Linda Hill, Curator/Archivist-CAAAS, serves on the organizing Committee (Design & Buildout) for the SUNO Museum (SUNOMA) and the CAAAS Archive. The SUNO-CAAAS Archive is 25% complete, including the finished design, build-out, and essential equipment. The archive organizational strategy proceeded through the Project Facilities Manager, Mrs. Tracey Webster. Ms. Hill helped fulfill a design protocol that includes a floor plan, furniture, and equipment (such as computers, printers, and scanners) and preparation for products and supplies. In addition, an upgraded computer system will provide:

- Storage accommodations.
- Software with associated workshops.
- Scanning techniques that yield state-ofthe-art archive reception and maintenance.

The Archive needs to digitize three individual archival collections and placement a Digital Content Manager. The training for the Fujitsu Fi 7700 Document Scanner - 600 dpi x 600 dpi is complete. The Fujitsu Scanner will enable the Archive to be digitized, augmented, organized, and shared.

Academic Excellence Initiatives

Curstin Kaufman Sets the Pace for IC3 GS6 Certification Program at SUNO

The first tangible outcome of the IC3 Certification training program funded through a technology grant from the Louisiana Board of Regents emerged on September 30, 2021 when Ms. Curstin Kaufman, a Computer Information Systems major at SUNO's College of Business & Public Administration earned her IC3 GS6 Level 1 Certification. Ms. Kaufman achieved this feat despite the IC3 Certification Training Boot Camp program being interrupted for two weeks in September by Hurricane Ida. Curstin rapidly moved on to earn her IC3 GS6 Level 2 Certification on October 9 and her Master Certification (IC3 GS6 Level 3 Certification) on October 14, 2021. Curstin is an example of what is possible for many of our students. Upon completing all three levels of the IC3 certification, Curstin is now prepping for AWS certification (sponsored through the DXC Partnership grant) and Communication Skills for Business certification. Asked what motivated her to take on the task of earning her certification with such zeal and speed, Curstin indicated that she is "well aware that stackable IT credentials on top of her college degree will open doors to unimaginable career opportunities and earning potentials." She made it clear that making small investments in extracurricular learnings such as IT certification will separate her from any future competition. The College of Business & Public Administration commends Curstin for being a pacesetter.

Fifteen additional SUNO business students including Carl C. Alexis, Dariane M. Lewis, Michael John Sentino, Rondale Beckwith, Tatyana Brisby; Paul Gbogi, Malery A. Louis, Lucies David Thompson, Keandra Deche' Darjean, Jyothi Sree Kanakamedela, Brandi M. Robert, Catyris Torry, Giselle Rogers, Gregory Joseph Lazard Jr., and Anthony Charles Mason have earned at least one level of the IC3 GS6 certification since September 2021. Two St. Mary's High School students (Sha'La Elizabeth Quincy and Kyla Moore) earned the IC3 GS6 Level 1 Certification. Several SUNO students, staff, and high school students are still on the hunt for at least IC3 GS6 Level 1 Certification before December 2021. The College commends Mr. Randy Wild, the Fall 2021 IC3 Certification Training Boot Camp facilitator, for his persistence, tenacity, and caring attitude. Dr. Igwe E. Udeh, Dean of the College of Business & Public Administration, is the grant's Principal Investigator. At the same time, Dr. David Alijani and Dr. Obyun Kwun from the Computer Information Systems Department are Co-Principal Investigators.



Using Andragogy to Enhance Classroom Learning Experience

To enhance business students' technical and analytical learning experience in MGMT 491 (Leadership and Decision Making) class, the instructor assigned them to research selected contemporary IT topics outside the course and have the issues presented during designated class days before them their peers. This process was not only based on the andragogic learning method but also an example of a flipped classroom method. The andragogic method is based on the premise that adults learn best when the focus is on them and control their learning. Several students in the class were excited to volunteer to present. The first to make such a presentation was Brandy George, a graduating senior majoring in Business Administration. Ms. George's assigned topic was "Understanding Digital Standards," which focused on the laws governing the use of intellectual property created by others. Her presentation distinguished ownership rights of images in the public domain and explained how to legally access each group of images. Ms. George also shared with the class some of the common mistakes made while creating and posting pictures on social media that could unwittingly expose an individual's privacy, a protected group, or neighbors. She fielded several questions at the end of the presentation.

Public Administration Club Partners with Candidate Robertson to Provide Relief to the SUNO Family

The Public Administration Association leveraged its relationship with Dr. Patricia Boyd-Robertson, a Fall 2021 candidate for the New Orleans Office of Clerk of Criminal District Court, to distribute food, sanitary goods, and household items to SUNO students affected by the August 2021 Hurricane Ida. The giveaway, which took place on Thursday, October 14, 2021, at College of Business Plaza, was preceded with words of encouragement and prayers for healing and comfort for those who were affected by the Hurricane by Rev. IT Department, and Bookstore representatives to resolve student technology issues.


