

COLLEGE OF ARTS & SCIENCES

EXPANSION OF THE COLLEGE OF GRADUATE STUDIES

With the expansion of the College of Graduate Studies to include the Office of Professional Studies, efforts to increase our certificates and micro-credentials were enhanced. Awarding of micro credentials/digital badges, funded by our NTIA CMC Grant, the Office of Professional Studies has successfully developed and issued digital badges through Credly for three workforce-aligned competencies: Project Management (7 badges), Database Management (7 badges), and Business Communications (48 badges). On June 5, 2025, a total of 65 graduates from SUNO's College of Business and Public Administration were awarded these digital credentials as part of our continued effort to enhance post-graduate career readiness, professional branding, and digital credentialing access among learners.

MUSEUM STUDIES

Dr. Haitham Eid remained active in local and international museum initiatives this fall. On September 8, 2025, he joined the Global New Orleans Board of Directors meeting and will lead a cultural exchange trip to Egypt from October 6–18. While in Cairo, he delivered U.S. State Department–sponsored workshops at Helwan and Ain Shams Universities on "Museums in Transition."

He also presented at the Louisiana Association of Museums Conference (Sept. 14–16) on the America 250 State Commission. From Sept. 15–17, SUNO's MA Museum Studies Program hosted Grand Egyptian Museum experts Anwar Rashed and Dr. Nasef Abdelwahed, who shared best practices in preventive conservation and identified ancient Egyptian artifacts at NOMA for a forthcoming publication.

MUSEUM STUDIES GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT

Southern University at New Orleans is proud to highlight the international impact of its Museum Studies program. Dr. Haitham Eid has been invited by the U.S. Department of State Speaker Program to deliver a series of talks in Egypt.

His engagements will include the Egyptian Ministry of Culture, the American Research Center in Egypt (ARCE), the American Embassy in Cairo, the International Council of Museums (ICOM), and several cultural heritage institutions, further strengthening SUNO's global presence in museum studies and cultural exchange.
