


On April 11, 2023, Southern University at Shreveport (SUSLA) and Northwestern State University of Louisiana (NSU) entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for a cooperative articulation agreement to accept graduates of SUSLA's Associate of Applied Science Degree program in Engineering Technology (Electrical and Computer Engineering Concentration) by transferring 60 credit hours toward NSU's Bachelor of Science in Electronics Technology. SUSLA and NSU share the goal of developing a regional partnership by providing collaboration and commitment with industry partners by securing employment for program completers.





## SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM RECEIVES GRANT FROM LOUISIANA ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (LED): \$207K



SUSLA's Surgical Technology Program, under the direction of Coordinator Didaciane Keys, has been awarded \$206,850 from the Louisiana Community and Technical College System (LCTCS) Rapid Response Grant. This funding is made possible by the Legislature of Louisiana to assist individuals in their ability to function in the workplace, including education directed at refining or developing literacy or other basic skills; programs directed at lifelong learning or continuing education; job readiness training; vocational, technical, occupation education, or associate degree level accreditation.

The grant funds will be used to enhance and upgrade the existing Surgical Technology program at Southern University Shreveport with an Anatomage Table and provide supplies and testing fee assistance for students. SUSLA has a unique role in North Louisiana as the only two-year Historically Black College and University that educates underprepared and minority students and has demonstrated an ability to provide access and success to its customer base. SUSLA has a special niche in healthcare and a proven ability to meet the underserved where they are, academically and socially.

Surgical Technology is a 72-hour/22-month program that provides students with the knowledge and skills required to enter the field. The graduates earn an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in Surgical Technology and can take the test to obtain the National Certification in Surgical Technology (CST). The Program is accredited by The Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP). Surgical Techs are highly trained professionals who assist in preparing patients and operating rooms for surgery and serve as an extra set of hands during surgical procedures.

## CONGRATULATIONS TO DR. AUBRA J. GANTT THE NEXT CHANCELLOR FOR SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY AT SHREVEPORT



The Southern University System unanimously approved President Dennis J. Shields' recommendation of Aubra Gantt as the next chancellor of Southern University Shreveport (SUSLA) on Friday, March 17, 2023.

Gantt, a native of Shreveport, has more than 25 years of progressive experience in postsecondary education, and has served in various state government, academic affairs, student affairs, enrollment management, and clinical behavioral and mental health positions. She currently serves as a clinician at various hospitals in Phoenix, Arizona.

Southern University System President-Chancellor Dennis J. Shields thanked the search committee for their diligence and dedication. The committee consisted of a variety of stakeholders, including student government, community workforce, SUSLA faculty and staff, city government, and alumni. "She (Gantt) is a product of Southern University and this community," said Sam Gilliam, Board member. "Southern and Shreveport are proving to be training grounds for leadership."

After the unanimous vote by the Board to approve her appointment, Gantt immediately recognized her alma maters and hometown. "It is good to be home," said Gantt, a graduate of Green Oaks High School in Shreveport. "I am an alumnus of SUSLA, Southern University Baton Rouge, and Southern University at New Orleans. All of this (career successes) is because of the foundation laid for me by the Southern University educational system."

Gantt pledged to continue SUSLA's success by enhancing partnerships, technology, and in-demand programs that prepare students for a global workforce. "When we are collaborative, committed and courageous, then we will be on our way to being unapologetically excellent," Gantt said.

Gantt began her professional educational career at SUSLA, where she served in numerous positions, including TRiO Educational Talent Search counselor and Registrar. She served as dean of enrollment management at Scottsdale Community College in the Maricopa Community College District, one of the largest two-year college systems in the nation.

Gantt is the founding vice president for academic outreach and student success at the Tarrant County College (TCC) Connect Campus in Fort Worth, Texas, one of the most comprehensive community colleges in the nation. She also served as registrar at the TCC Northwest Campus for 13 years.

With 15 years of college teaching and counseling experience, Gantt has served as an adjunct instructor at TCC; Tarleton State University in Fort Worth, Texas; and Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Arizona. Gantt holds a bachelor's degree in liberal studies from Southern University and A&M College in Baton Rouge; a master's degree in social work from Southern University at New Orleans, and a doctorate of education in higher education administration from the University of North Texas in Denton, Texas.

### CONGRATULATIONS TO DR. KENIE MOSES ON RECEIVING THE SUSLA 2023 ABOVE AND BEYOND AWARD



The "Above and Beyond" Award was established to help inspire and motivate Southern University employees to reach their maximum performance. One award is presented at the SUS Board of Supervisors meeting each month. This award honors outstanding achievements in the workplace, exceptional contributions toward efficiency and effectiveness of operations, special efforts in promoting workforce excellence, or outstanding service to the University community and constituents.

Dr. Moses serves as Professor and Head of the Department of Engineering & Technology at Southern University at Shreveport (SUSLA) whose career at SUSLA started in 2019. The two-time Southern University alumnus is the "Above and Beyond" Award recipient for March 2023. As a testament to Dr. Moses' hard work and dedication to Southern University and its students, the Department developed and established an Engineering Technology degree program with concentrations and more than six certificate of technical studies programs representative of industry needs. To ensure that the Department is comprehensive in its approach to reaching as many minds as possible, Dr. Moses and his team created the STEM Summer Enrichment Academy (SSEA) which is an 8-week STEM-based, curriculum-guided, Summer program for youth in grades 8-12 which provides hands-on activities and training certificates upon completion.

In addition to his role as Department Head, Dr. Moses also serves as the Project Coordinator for STEM Grant Initiatives and manages numerous grants in the STEM area. Over the course of Dr. Moses' tenure at SUSLA, he and his team has been instrumental in securing a number of local, state, and federal grants for the Department of Engineering and Technology as well as other departments at SUSLA totaling over \$4,000,000.

Dr. Moses is the proud father of Erick and Ja'Kyra Rye, both alumni of Southern University at Shreveport. In addition, Dr. Moses' sister and brother, Jackie and Chad Moses, are also alumni of Southern University at Shreveport.



### NATIONAL CENTER FOR CONSTRUCTION, EDUCATION, AND RESEARCH (NCCER): SUSLA & THE HOUSING AUTHORITY FOR THE CITY OF SHREVEPORT PARTNERSHIP







The Housing Authority for the City of Shreveport (HACS) in collaboration with the City of Shreveport Community Development, Southern University at Shreveport along with a host of partners seek to prepare at-risk and out-of-school youth ages 16-24 residing in Caddo Parish for the world of work and to be equipped with the resources to earn a livable wage through the YouthBuild Shreveport Program (YBS).

The program provides occupational training opportunities to Shreveport youth including the chance to earn their high school equivalency diploma (HiSET) though non-traditional classroom experiences and service-learning projects. Students gain valuable workforce skills, knowledge, abilities, and certifications in apprenticeship programs focused on entry-level construction skills. The YouthBuild Shreveport program rewards participants for their service with stipends, provides leadership opportunities, and creates pathways to postsecondary education and job placement referrals. YBS will educate and train 84 youth who are high school dropouts, adjudicated youth, academically underserved, and economically disadvantaged.

The Southern University at Shreveport Department of Workforce Development (SUSLA WD) in partnership with the Housing Authority of the City of Shreveport (HACS) provides construction trades training opportunities for at-risk youth to advance their education and economic prospects. Dr. John K. Galiotos, Dean of Workforce Development and Associate Professor of Chemistry, who is the Project PI, and his team members Mr. Sherman Vogel Construction Instructor and Mr. Denis Holmes EPA Program Instructor ensure that the students will be safely and effectively trained, and skills certified for jobs in the building and construction industries.

Currently, the training for NCCER certified skills validation and credentialing is in its second cohort with 12 students. Already, 12 cohort students have successfully completed the first 12 - week construction program. The SUSLA WD - HACS project provides Core Training in construction technology. Students completed NCCER requirements testing and profile performance skills and competencies on safely utilization of hand and power tools employed in construction industries.

Students have renovated two buildings, which include the main office building and the large shop. The main building includes an instructional area and a computer lab. The large shop area renovated consist of painting, setting up the tool crib, building a lumber rack, build a stationary cut off saw, build a portable multiple tool station, renovate a residential wiring training unit, and laid out safety zones for stationary tools and lecture areas according to OSHA regulations. Additionally, students received 10 hrs. OSHA and 4 hrs. CPR/First Aid training and certification credentials. These additional skills make them better prepared for careers in construction technology related jobs.

Graduating students: Trevion Simmons, Tim Christian, Brian Morris, and Jaylon Bridgewater will be placed this April at Calumet Industries. Other students, who are currently employed part-time by HACS, are Cartes Thomas and Sylvester Harp.

She has held administrative assistant positions in the banking corporation, gaming industry and the higher educational area which has equipped her with experience in the executive arena. Ms. Winzer has served SUSLA with excellence for sixteen years. In chronological order, she has served and assisted a total four (4) Chancellors during her tenure at SUSLA:
