The Community Education for Life Transition Program (CELT) is an initiative serving young adults, ages 18-22 with mild to moderate disabilities. CELT, held in collaboration with Green Oaks and Southern University at Shreveport Louisiana (SUSLA), provides the opportunity for young adults to grow and learn critical skills while gaining their independence.

Through the CELT Program, we prepare and aid students in transitioning successfully into age-appropriate peer/role models. Students are afforded the opportunity to participate in various academic classes on SUSLA's campus. Learning encompasses managing schedules independently and maintaining some academic training and life skills, which will help them transition into adult-focused responsibilities.

In the classroom, our students are supported extensively by the teacher, para, trained support staff, and SUSLA student volunteers. CELT students receive one-on-one advising in addition to team-based project learning. Creating a space with dynamic learning and engagement. We hope that these opportunities give students the tools they need to improve their overall quality of life as they transition into adulthood.

Each year CELT students participate in SUSLA's graduation ceremony. This year we celebrate Miss Crutchfield, CELT Class of 2022.

Jaguar Academy allows for our TRiO participants to receive a collegiate jump-start while in high school. Too often, because our participants are not afforded an opportunity to earn college credit while in high school, the academic achievement gap is widening. Jaguar Academy, however, ensures our participants are provided an equitable academic pre-collegiate experience while in high school. "Participation in Jaguar Academy aligns academic content with cultural exposure to eliminate the academic barriers often faced by TRiO participants," says Danielle Anderson, TRiO Dual Enrollment Chair.

The Jaguar Academy orientation held on May 5, 2022, welcomed TRiO participants and parents to SUSLA from five different Northwest Louisiana parishes. During the orientation, participants and parents were introduced to their Summer 2022 instructors and courses. For TRiO participants, Jaguar Academy also has an aim to ease the transition from high school to college. The academic rigors and non-cognitive skills gained as a Jaguar Academy participant provide meaningful academic experiences, free of charge. Jaguar Academy participants are exposed to the SUSLA environment, including SUSLA student services such as the library, and computer labs. All TRiO participants are encouraged to take advantage of this unique opportunity with Southern University at Shreveport.

TRIO AMBASSADORS GROOMED FOR PROFESSIONALISM





The event was led by renowned leaders, Dr. Robbie Melton, the Associate Vice President — SMART Global Technology Innovation Center, and Dr. Gerry Hanley, Executive Director, Merlot and Skills Commons. The team provided an overview of their efforts to curate and share their HBCU Affordable Learning Solutions Cultural Curation and Open Education Resources. Dr. McEachin described the event as an outstanding opportunity to join a panel of distinguished scholars to share strategies that have been implemented at HBCUs.

Dr. McEachin was invited to participate on a panel at the Online Learning Consortium (OLC) 2022 Conference. She shared how Southern University at Shreveport is developing online courses using Open Education Resources (OER).

Dr. McEachin shared her course development template that was created based on the Quality Matters standards. She provided instructions on how to create online courses using OER. She shared the importance of aligning course objectives, activities, and assessments when creating an online course.



CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR JUNE JAGUAR OF THE MONTH — MRS. YUVETTE ALLEN



Accudemia is a cloud-based academic center management system that allows administrators and educators to track and manage student interaction, improving daily operations, and streamline record keeping and record sharing.

It has an easy-to-use interface through which administrators and students can schedule appointments online and even provide feedback about their experience. In addition to the product itself, Accudemia comes with excellent support provided via phone, email, and live online meetings.

The Accudemia platform was introduced to SUSLA through Mr. Willie Siglar II and the Center for Student Success and is now being used by both the Office of E-Learning and the SUSLA Connect program.

Each of these departments currently using Accudemia have seen the benefits primarily in the areas:
