### Dear President Shields:

This letter is a recommendation and request to modify the commencement exercise at Southern University and A&M College beginning December 2024. Currently, the commencement exercise lasts about four hours in length.

Based on my review of Best Practices throughout the Higher Education Ecosystem, I believe it would benefit Southern University and A&M College to hold separate commencement exercises for graduates receiving a master's, doctorate, or professional degree. Institutions such as North Carolina Central University and Tuskegee University conduct separate commencement exercises for their graduate and professional degree candidates, which serves as a good example.

The Office of Academic Affairs surveyed the issue of separate commencement exercises, and the results overwhelmingly favored this approach. Modifying the current practice would make commencement exercises more manageable and enhance the experience for everyone involved.

I respectfully request that this recommendation be presented for consideration, and approval, by the Southern University Board of Supervisors at its June 21, 2024, board meeting.

RE: Expansion for MSW Program to Southern University A&M College - Conversation with Southern University New Orleans (SUNO)

#### Dear President Shields:

Dr. Damien Ejigiri and Dr. Charmaine Williams from the Nelson Mandela School of Government approached me with an exciting proposal to expand the esteemed MSW program at SUNO to SUBR through collaborative efforts between the two sister institutions within the Southern University System. The primary goal of this collaboration is to significantly increase enrollment in the MSW program and graduate school enrollment.

The current undergraduate social work program at Southern University and A&M College produces graduates who often pursue the MSW degree at Louisiana State University, or other online/virtual programs that do not require travel to New Orleans. Furthermore, Southeastern Louisiana University is also venturing into the MSW market. By joining forces, we intend to retain more graduates with bachelor's degrees within the Southern University System, channeling them into our graduate school program.

Following discussions with Dr. James Ammons, he is intrigued by the possibilities and advantages this collaboration would bring to the sister institutions and the entire Southern University System. Although there are details that need ironing out, the successful execution of this expansion endeavor could potentially lead to the development of a future JD/MSW dual degree program between the Southern University Law Center and its sister institutions.

I respectfully propose presenting this idea to the Southern University Board of Supervisors at its June 21, 2024, meeting as an informational item for discussion.

## Southern University System General Operating Budget Interim Financial Statement For Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2024 As of May 31, 2024 Executive Summary

Attached is a summary of the Southern University System fiscal year 2023-2024 general operating budget financial activities for the month ending May 31, 2024. The Southern University System is reporting a \$2,131,685 increase in revenues. The increase primarily resulted from a gain in self-generated revenues.

#### Southern University Board and System Administration

The System Office is funded from state appropriations and there is no projected shortfall in revenues.

#### Southern University Baton Rouge Campus

The Baton Rouge Campus projected Fall 2023, Spring 2024, and Summer 2024 tuition exceeded the amount budgeted by \$4,417,242. The Baton Rouge Campus is using these funds to offset the increase cost in salaries, related benefits, travel, supplies, professional services, other charges, acquisitions, and scholarships.

#### **Southern University Law Center**

The Law Center has a \$701,672 projected shortfall in Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 tuition as compared to the approved budget. The Law Center has reduced related benefits, travel, operating expenditures, supplies, professional services, other charges, and acquisitions to balance the operating budget for the fiscal year.

#### Southern University News Orleans Campus

The New Orleans Campus has a \$995,249 projected shortfall in self-generated revenue as compared to the approved budget. The New Orleans Campus has reduced salaries, related benefits, travel, supplies, professional services, and other charges to balance the operating budget for the fiscal year.

#### Southern University Shreveport Campus

The Shreveport Campus has a \$588,636 projected shortfall in Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 tuition as compared to the approved budget. The Shreveport Campus has reduced salaries, and related benefits to balance their operating budget for the fiscal year.

#### Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center

The Agricultural Research and Extension Center is funded from state appropriations and federal funds and there is no projected shortfall in revenues.

#### **Summary**

Based on the information above the campuses have made the appropriate adjustments to maintain a balance budget as of May 31, 2024. Revenues and expenditures will be monitored during the remainder of the 2023-2024 fiscal year to allow for a balanced operating budget.

#### I. POLICY STATEMENT AND RATIONALE

Accessible and well-developed policies promote efficiency, accountability, and minimize institutional risks. This systemwide policy promotes an expeditious policy development, review, and approval process, while allowing for robust debate and discussion of draft policies. It allows for a consistent policy format and the maintenance of an accessible online policy repository.

#### II. POLICY SCOPE AND AUDIENCE

The scope of this systemwide policy is both campus and system. It applies to all campus and system administrators, faculty and staff who develop, review, approve, publish, manage, or otherwise engage in the creation, promulgation, and dissemination of institutional policies.

#### III. POLICY COMPLIANCE

New and revised campus and system policies introduced for approval after the effective date of this policy shall comply with the requirements of this system wide policy. Enforcement of this policy ultimately rests with the system President and campus Chancellors.

#### IV. POLICY DEFINITIONS

Approval Official(s): The Chair of the Southern University System Board of Supervisors in conjunction with the System President shall serve as the signature authorities for this systemwide policy.

Board of Supervisors of the Southern University and A&M College System (Board): The Board is vested with the responsibility via the Louisiana State Constitution of 1974 and specific Louisiana Revised Statutes

for the management and supervision of its institutions, statewide agricultural programs and other programs which comprise the Southern University and A&M College System.

Campus Representative: A campus representative is an individual who is appointed by a campus chancellor to serve on the System Policy and Planning Committee and is responsible for sharing the proposed system policy information with stakeholders on their campus.

Exception(s): An interim policy is an example of an exception, where the policy's Responsible Official, with the approval of the Board Chair, System President (as it pertains to system policies), or Campus Chancellor (as it pertains to campus policies) may establish an interim policy in response to an emergency situation, like an Act of God, that may require the promulgation of emergency policies. An interim policy shall exist for up to six months from the effective date of issuance.

Executive Cabinet: Senior members of the System President's or Campus Chancellor's Leadership Team.

Policy Classification: Systemwide and campus policies shall follow the policy classification listed below:

- Enrollment Management (2-000)
- External Affairs & Public Relations (3-000)
- Facilities (4-000)

**Policy Implementation Procedures**: A series of interrelated steps or guidelines necessary to implement all system and campus policies.

Policy Review Cycle: This systemwide policy is subject to a five-year policy review cycle.

**Policy Template**: The Board approved <u>Official Policy on Policies Template</u> shall serve as the official template for the development, review and approval of all system and campus policies.

**Policy and Planning Committee**: At the system level, a systemwide policy and planning committee with representation from each campus shall be established to review and advance systemwide policies and system and campus strategic plans for ultimate approval by the System President and Board of Supervisors. Upon recommendations by both the Vice President for Strategic Planning and Policy and the General Counsel, who serve as the policy's responsible officials, the System President shall appoint members to the systemwide

policy and planning committee. The responsible officials, responsible for the implementation of this systemwide policy, shall chair and co-chair the systemwide committee.

At the campus level, a campus policy and planning committee with representation from each campus's governance groups (Student Government Association, Faculty Senate, Staff Senate) shall be established to review and advance campus wide policies and plans, including the campus's strategic plan for ultimate approval by the Chancellor. The campus Chancellor shall appoint members to the campus policy and planning committee, to include the General Counsel.

**Responsible Official(s)** and Unit: At the system level, a system Vice President or system Executive responsible for the development, review and implementation of a system policy, once approved. At the campus level, a campus Vice Chancellor or campus Executive responsible for the development, review and implementation of a campus policy, once approved.

System vs Campus Policies: System policies are initiated at the system level, reviewed by the system policy and planning committee and approved by both the System President and System Board of Supervisors. Campus policies are initiated the campus level, reviewed by the campus policy and planning committee and approved by the campus Chancellor. Policy scope and audience distinguish system policies from campus policies. While system policies are applicable across all Southern University campuses, campus policies are only applicable to the respective campus that initiates the policy. The Board approved Official Policy on Policies Template shall serve as the official template for the development, review and approval of all system and campus policies.

#### V. POLICY IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURES

Policy Development, Review and Approval Process: The development, review and approval of system policies shall follow the 7-Step process identified on the SU System Policy Development, Routing, and Checklist Form (see attached). Concurrently, the development, review and approval of campus policies shall follow the 7-Step process identified on the SU Campus Policy Development, Routing, and Checklist Form (see attached).

**Policy Template**: The Board approved <u>Official Policy on Policies Template</u> shall serve as the official template for the development, review and approval of all system and campus policies. With respect to system policies, the Chair of the Southern University Board of Supervisors in conjunction with the System President shall serve as the final signature authorities for all systemwide policies (see attached). With respect to campus policies, the campus Chancellor shall serve as the final signature authority for all campus policies (see attached).

**Policy Number**: The assignment of **Policy Numbers** by either the **SU System Policy and Planning Committee**, or the **SU Campus Policy and Planning Committee**, shall be as follows:

- With respect to system policies, the policy number will begin with the prefix **SUS** followed by the policy classification number and sequence.
  - o For example, the first systemwide academic affairs policy shall be numbered as SUS-1-001, where SUS is the prefix designated for system policies, 1 is the academic affairs policy classification designated number, and 001 is the first system academic affairs policy. Policy classifications are identified under Section IV Definitions, of this policy.

- With respect to campuses policies, the policy number will begin with the prefix for the campus (SUBR Southern University and A&M College; SUNO Southern University at New Orleans; SUSLA Southern University at Shreveport, SULC Southern University Law Center; and SUAREC Southern University Agricultural, Research, and Extension Center), followed by the policy classification number and sequence.
  - o For example, the first SUNO Campus academic affairs policy shall be numbered as SUNO-1-001, where SUNO is the prefix designated for SUNO campus policies, 1 is the academic affairs policy classification designated number, and 001 is the first SUNO campus academic affairs policy.

**Policy Logo**: All campus policies shall have the logo of the campus, while all system policies shall have the logo of the system at the top of the policy's first page.

**Policy Post-Approval Procedure**: With respect to system policies, the SU System Policy and Planning Committee shall electronically post and archive approved and signed system policies on the system website, on a designated policy page. With respect to campus policies, the SU Campus Policy and Planning Committee shall electronically post and archive approved and signed campus policies on the campus website on a designated campus policy page.

Board of Supervisors of the Southern University and A&M College System (Board): The Board is vested with the responsibility via the Louisiana State Constitution of 1974 and specific Louisiana Revised Statutes

for the management and supervision of its institutions, statewide agricultural programs and other programs which comprise the Southern University and A&M College System.

Council on Institutional Effectiveness: A system-wide council with representation from each campus established to advance institutional effectiveness priorities across the system.

*Exception*(s): An interim policy is an example of an exception, where the policy's Responsible Official, with the approval of the Board Chair and President-Chancellor may establish an interim policy in response to an emergency situation like an Act of God that may require the promulgation of emergency policies. An interim policy shall remain in force for up to six months from the effective date of issuance.

Executive Cabinet: Senior members of the President-Chancellor's leadership team.

Policy Classification: Within the Policy Manual, policies shall be classified as follows:

**Policy Committee**: A system-wide committee with representation from each campus established to review system policies prior to consideration by the President-Chancellor's Executive Cabinet.

Policy Implementation Procedures: A series of interrelated steps or guidelines necessary to implement policies.

Policy Review Cycle: This system policy is subject to a five-year policy review cycle.

**Policy Template**: The newly developed <u>Official Policy on Policies Template</u> shall serve as the official template for the development of system policies.

Responsible Official: The official that is responsible for the implementation of this policy.

Responsible Unit: The unit charged with oversight for the development, review, update, archive, and implementation of this policy.

#### V. POLICY IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURES

Policy Development, Review and Approval Process: All policies shall have a defined set of implementation procedures. With respect to the implementation of this system policy, the Responsible Official, a member of the President-Chancellor's Executive Cabinet, shall initiate the development of a new system policy or the review of an existing system policy under their jurisdiction. Consistent with the tenants of shared governance, the Responsible Official shall include the faculty via the Faculty Senate in the development and review of academic policies. Also, the development and review of non-academic policies shall include a cross-section of staff in the respective areas under the purview of the Responsible Official. Finally, the Responsible Official shall include a student representative via the Student Government Association in the development of new or review of existing system policies.

The Responsible Official shall use the <u>Official Policy on Policies Template</u> to submit a new or revised system policy to the <u>Policy Committee</u> under the purview of the <u>Council on Institutional Effectiveness</u> for review and approval. Next, the proposed system policy is forwarded to the <u>President-Chancellor's Executive Cabinet</u> for review and approval. # Articulation Agreement between Southern University at New Orleans and The Honoré Center

Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) and the Honoré Center have entered into this Articulation Agreement to foster cooperation and address the need for year-round residency for student members. This program ensures their persistence and overall well-being by providing oncampus living during summer and winter breaks. The Agreement aims to maintain students' routines, grant access to essential resources, and keep them connected to the Honoré community's support network.

According to the Agreement, Honoré Center members can continue their on-campus residence during breaks when other students must return home or make alternative arrangements. Each member will pay \$1,400.00 for the summer break periods (May to June \$700.00 and July to August \$700.00) and \$1,000.00 for the winter break period (December to January).

Honoré Center members must be enrolled in at least three (3) credit hours during the semester, including summer, to live on campus and to remain "on time and on target" to graduate in at least four (4) years. The Honoré Center and its members are responsible for timely payments, using reasonable care of the premises, responsible for any damages outside of regular wear and tear, and ensuring no additional guests reside in the hall. The Honoré Center acknowledges limited oversight by SUNO staff/administration during the specified periods and accepts responsibility for any damages caused by its members.

Additionally, SUNO acknowledges that it receives funds from various sources in support of the Honoré Center and its mission. SUNO will honor and adhere to the specific intentions of the donated or appropriated funds and will work with the Honoré Center to ensure the same.

We, the representatives of the Honoré Center and SUNO, agree to the terms of this agreement, which will be for an initial period of three (3) years from June 21, 2024. After the initial term, this agreement will continue until a new agreement or dissolution is submitted.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the Southern University System (the "Board") has the responsibility and authority to manage and direct the affairs of the Southern University System (the "System"), and to control and dispose of its property; and

WHEREAS, the State of Louisiana and the Southern University System purchased the property described below in May of 2000;

WHEREAS, the Southern University System Foundation has an interest in acquiring property that is owned by the State of Louisiana and the Southern University System;

WHEREAS, in anticipation of this Resolution, the System has requested approval from the Division of Administration and the Louisiana Legislature to transfer the below-referenced property;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board as follows:

Contingent upon the approval of the Louisiana Legislature, and in accordance with the Board's Agreements and Contracts Policy (6-008), the System, acting through its President or his designated representative, is authorized to transfer via any legal manner, including sale, and execute all required documents on behalf of the System, the following property to the Southern University Foundation.

A CERTAIN LOT OR PORTION OF GROUND, together with all the buildings and improvements thereon, situated in the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana in that subdivision thereof known as SOUTHERN HEIGHTS, and being more particularly described according to the official map of said subdivision on file and of record in the office of the Clerk and Recorder for said Parish and State of LOT NUMBER THIRTY-SIX (36) said subdivision, said lot having such measurements and dimensions as are shown on the official recorded subdivision map.
